

- Inventory Status Rev1 completed
 - Not due till 10/2024, so ESWA has been trying to investigate and get the "Unknown Possible Lead" more accurate by Field investigations.
- 5,466 = Unknown, Possible Lead / 29,668 have been confirmed not lead
 78% copper, 6% Unknown (not lead) 16% Unknown (Possible lead)

- 313 Lead Replacement since 1/2000
 - Ave in-house cost \$3,650 / service replaced
- 36 Known lead service to replace
